## Drug Alternative Program Services...

Cliff and Freddie Harris, Co-Directors, operate a 12-18 month residential program for men. The facility includes an 8-bed recovery home with 3800 sq. ft. and 3 1/2 acres.

Because of the Christian lifestyle, approximately 65% of DAP graduates have remained sober and lead productive lives. This is in contrast to the 16-20% success rate of traditional programs.

The daily services include food, shelter, work, individual, group and family therapy, recreational activities, spiritual counseling; a total therapeutic environment.

He graduated in 1999. After working for the program one year, Cliff highly recommended him for a job at Riverside Highland Water Company in Grand Terrace, CA where he has been employed for 20 years. Rick says the key to his success is a consistent relationship with God and staying connected to DAP.



Anthony Frazier, 2001 graduate, a crack cocaine addict for 20 years, caused his sick mother grief and stress. After her death, he faced homelessness. He read Cliff's book and wanted to be like him. Anthony graduated from Loma Linda University School of Nursing as an R.N. He has faced cancer in his leg, a knee amputation, a heart transplant, and he has never regressed. He is married and enjoys his work as an R.N.
